## STUDENT ABSENCES

When your child is going to be absent from school, please call the **Absence Line at 304-291-9201, EARLY** in the morning. Give your child's name, their teacher's name, and the reason for the absence. When your child returns to school following the absence, please send a note with the names of the child and teacher, and the reason for the absence.

If you receive an automated call, at approximately 11:00 A.M., about your child's absence, that information is taken from the daily attendance data submitted to our office by the teacher. You **do not need** to contact the school, unless you had forgotten to call the Absence Line that morning. The 11:00 A.M. call is not related to the Absence Line information. It is based solely on the teacher's report of student absences in the classroom.
